

Motivating Students

MathsFacts in a Flash has many motivational tools built into the program. Select motivators that are appropriate for your students.

- Set individual or class targets for mastering a certain number of levels each week. Use the Class Progress Report to monitor student progress. Be sure to choose a reasonable number of levels based on each student's individual ability.
- Congratulate students when they master a level by writing encouraging messages on their Test TOPS Reports.
- Celebrate students' successes by printing and awarding MathsFacts in a Flash certificates.
- Send home TOPS or Parent Reports to involve parents in their child's success. The Parent Report lists the levels an individual student has mastered.
- In addition to regular MathsFacts in a Flash time, allow students to work on MathsFacts in a Flash when they complete other schoolwork early. You may want to let students access Renaissance Responders and NEO2s for offline practice throughout the school day.
- If students master all assigned levels and seek additional challenge, have them attempt lower time targets at previously mastered levels.
- Challenge students to try and better their original mastery time on any previously mastered level. This option appears at students' log-on or after students master any level.
- Encourage students to practice maths facts at home, at any levels they choose, using Renaissance Home Connect™.
